1. Breed Class entries must be Registered with Breed Association. Definitions: ATCP 160.08 and ATCP 160.09 (3). Animals may not be shown in the open show.
2. All sheep entered, must be identified with official scrapie ear tags or other scrapie identification.
3. Sheep exposed to scrapie will not be allowed for exhibition.
4. Animals must be checked-in, weighed-in and ultrasounded between 9 a.m. – 11 a.m. on Wednesday or may be brought in on Tuesday night at the liability of the exhibitor.
5. Sheep have priority to the wash racks on Wednesday until 4 p.m.

All youth exhibitors are required to attend three (3) clinics to be eligible to show at the Jackson County Fair. YQCA is required for all youth that have not tested out of the requirement.

Each exhibitor must participate in the showmanship class to be eligible for the sale. Use age as of January 1 of show year.

LEAD CLASS

REGULATIONS:

1. To be shown at beginning of Jr. Sheep Show.
2. Open to all Jr. Sheep Exhibitors.
3. Participants shall wear attire made with wool fabric (garments may be purchases or made).
4. The class will be judged on percentage as follows:
 - a. 40% on attire of exhibit
 - b. 30% on personality and showmanship
 - c. 30% on sheep and manner in which it is handled
5. Any sheep may be used in this class.
6. Sheep are to be halter broke to lead.
7. Entrants shall provide sheep superintendent with a short resume including name, age, address, parents, description of outfit and youth activities within the sheep industry before the time of the show.
8. Use age as of January 1 of show year.

BREEDING CLASSES

REGULATIONS:

1. In Jr. Division, all wool breed classes of sheep including registered Columbias, Corriedales, Natural Colored, Rambouillets, and Targhees shall be shown with 1 inch of wool or more. All other meat breeds shown with 1 inch or less of wool.
2. Registered animals must have proper identification and registration.

MARKET CLASSES

REGULATIONS:

1. All market lambs will be shown with no measurable wool from behind the head to the hock.
2. Ewe lambs or wethers will be allowed in market classes.
3. Market lambs may be divided into 3 weight classes if numbers permit.
4. Minimum weight for a market lamb shall be 110 pounds to be eligible for sale.
5. Each exhibitor may exhibit 3 market lambs.
6. Exhibitors may exhibit only one animal per weight class, except two in the heaviest weight class.
7. Animals not meeting weight requirements will not be eligible to receive special awards.
8. No coloring above the hocks and knees on lambs.
9. No ice/cooler or other methods of cooling towels, etc. will be permitted. Tap water wet towels are allowed.

LIVESTOCK TOTAL PERFORMANCE AWARD – JUNIOR FAIR

This award will be present to the exhibitor whose animal best performs in all phases of livestock competition at the Jackson County Fair. Recognition will be based upon live show placing and rank in the carcass show. Evaluation procedures to determine the total performance award for each species of livestock will be based upon the lowest combination for ranking scores from the three areas of competition. Live ranking will designate Grand and Reserve Champion as first and second respectively followed by the class standing positions, blue group through pink group. Carcass rankings are determined by numerical placings.
