**ATTENTION: EXHIBITORS WHO PLAN ON TYING THEIR ANIMALS WITH THE JUNIOR FAIR CATTLE MUST NOTIFY THE JUNIOR FAIR SUPERINTENDENT AND CLUB OF THEIR INTENTION.**

**Regulations:**

1. No power washers permitted.
2. No horns, except for December or younger calves.
3. Open class dairy is open to exhibitors outside of Jackson County, but limited to the surrounding counties of Trempealeau, Monroe, Eau Claire, Clark, Wood, Juneau, & La Crosse. Space priority will go to Jackson County Residents, available space will be on a first come, first serve. The exhibitor fees will be \$7.00.
4. All first and second placed animals go in for the champion class.
5. No substitutions unless permission is granted from the Superintendent.
6. Animals may be check-in starting Wednesday at 1pm but must be checked-in by noon on Friday.
7. Sheep have priority to the wash racks on Wednesday until 4 p.m.
