2. Beginner – 1st & 2nd year in project; Intermediate – 3rd & 4th year in project; Advanced – 5th year or more in project.
3. Exhibitors should water fresh cut floral displays during the fair.
4. Any item of 3 stems should be identical in color, size, and variety.
5. Superintendent has the right to reject any flower or plant.

REGULATIONS:

1. Plants should be house plants suitable only for indoors.
2. Beginner – 1st & 2nd year in project, intermediate – 3rd & 4th year in project, advanced – 5th year and more in project.
3. Beginners need to have started their plants after the last fair season or this 4-H year.
4. Plants exhibited must be started, grown and cared for by the exhibitor.
5. Attach a card with the date started, characteristics, and care of the plant.
6. Use a straw, pencil or skewer in the planter to attach the card and entry tag, tape does not hold!
7. Exhibitors are responsible for water plants during the fair.

CLASS E – FLOWER BARRELS

REGULATIONS:

1. Flower barrels will be furnished by the Fair Board.
2. All planters must be in place where the Fair Board tells you to place them by 10:30am on Thursday of the Fair.
3. Check the judging schedule for specific judging time. Someone from the club or group is invited to be at their flower barrel to answer questions or may write on a 3"x5" card an explanation of the plants and flowers used, and theme of the flower barrel. The card should be submitted to the superintendent at fair entry time.
4. Entry tag is required.
5. Group entries require separate entry and tags.
6. Group entries require separate entry and tags.
7. The barrels only receive a ribbon except the Fair Board will award a cash prize to the top three barrels in the amount of: 1st - \$20, 2nd - \$10, and 3rd - \$5
